



Trevor Langdon is an entrepreneur and corporate sustainability advocate with a focus on commercial office waste and environmental reporting. Since 2011, Trevor has built Green Standards from the ground up and currently serves as Chief Executive Officer of the company. Based in Toronto, Trevor leads a team of environmental and real estate specialists as they sustainably decommission more than 20 million square feet of office space annually, cumulatively reducing CO<sub>2</sub>e by more than 152,000 tonnes on global corporate real estate projects around the world.

Under Trevor's leadership, Green Standards has diverted 100,000 tons of workplace furniture and equipment from landfill (a 98.6% diversion rate) and generated nearly \$40 million of in-kind donations to 5,000+ non-profits and community organizations. For this work, Trevor has been named to the Clean50, recognizing individuals who have done the most to advance the cause of sustainability and clean capitalism in Canada. He also accepted a Global Innovator's Award for Real Estate Excellence from CoreNet Global in 2020. Trevor holds a Bachelor of Commerce degree from McMaster University and has served as a sessional lecturer at the Rotman School of Management at University of Toronto since 2016.
